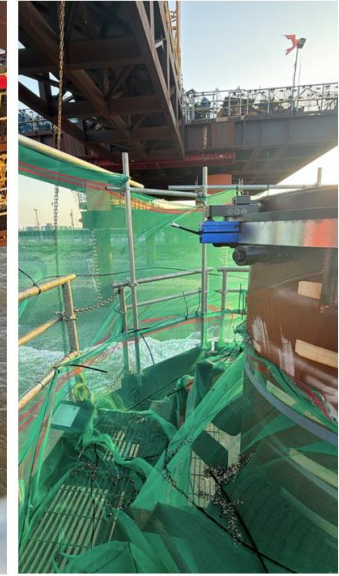
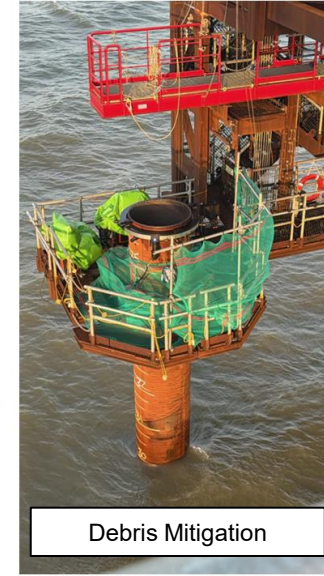


Main Construction Area: Marine Bulk Import Facility (MBIF)



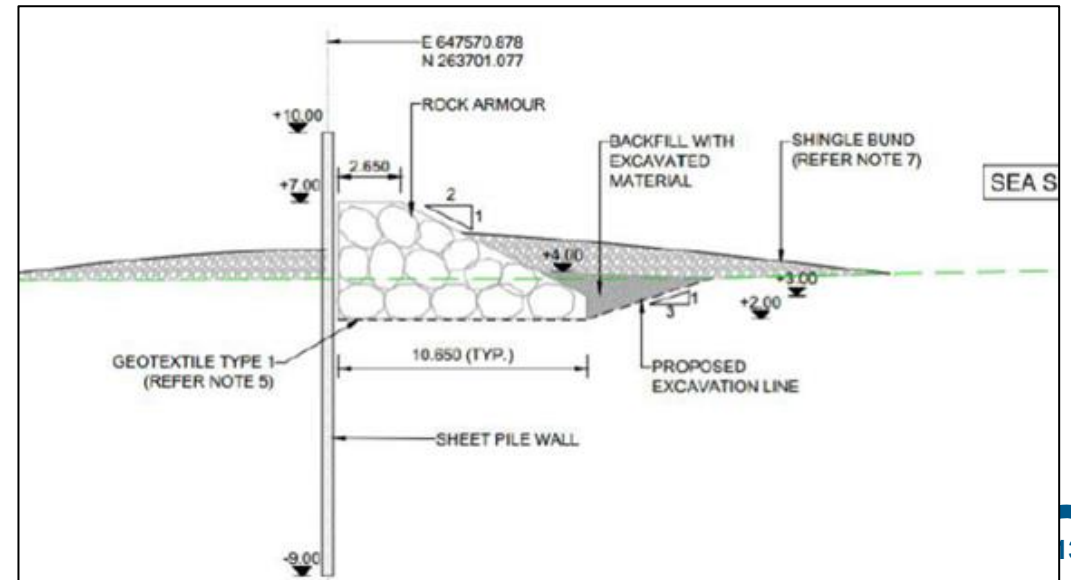
MBIF Beach – Debris Found on beach

- Installation of netting around the perimeter of the Canti-travel to prevent falling objects and swarf.
- Protective deck installed above the Public right of way.
- A protective cover is being installed around the steel piles whilst cutting operations are taking place, to catch metal shavings and prevent them from falling onto the beach or into the sea.
- Tethering of tools to eliminates the risk of tools falling onto the beach / into the sea.
- Conducting beach sweeps regularly, to search for any items – Using metal detectors and rakes to comb the beach.
- Exclusion zones have been setup to prevent the public walking beneath active work areas and the beach open.
- Keeping the number of personnel on the Canti-travel to a minimum.
- Marshalling on the beach during lifting operations, whilst we are still working close to the beach.



Main Site: Flood Defences Rock Armour

- Under nuclear safety requirements, Sizewell B relies on a 10-metre-high primary sea defence extending north of its site boundary to protect against extremely rare coastal flooding events.
- To maintain this level of protection during construction, Sizewell C will install a hybrid temporary defence comprising a 10-metre sheet pile wall (mostly in place) and a rock armour revetment along 340 metres of coastline
- The works involve the delivery of around 6,700 rocks, each weighing between three and six tonnes. The material is being sourced from Norway before being transported to the Port of Great Yarmouth and then delivered to Sizewell C's Temporary Construction Area for storage ahead of installation later this year.
- The rock armour solution has been developed specifically to meet Sizewell B's nuclear safety functional requirements.

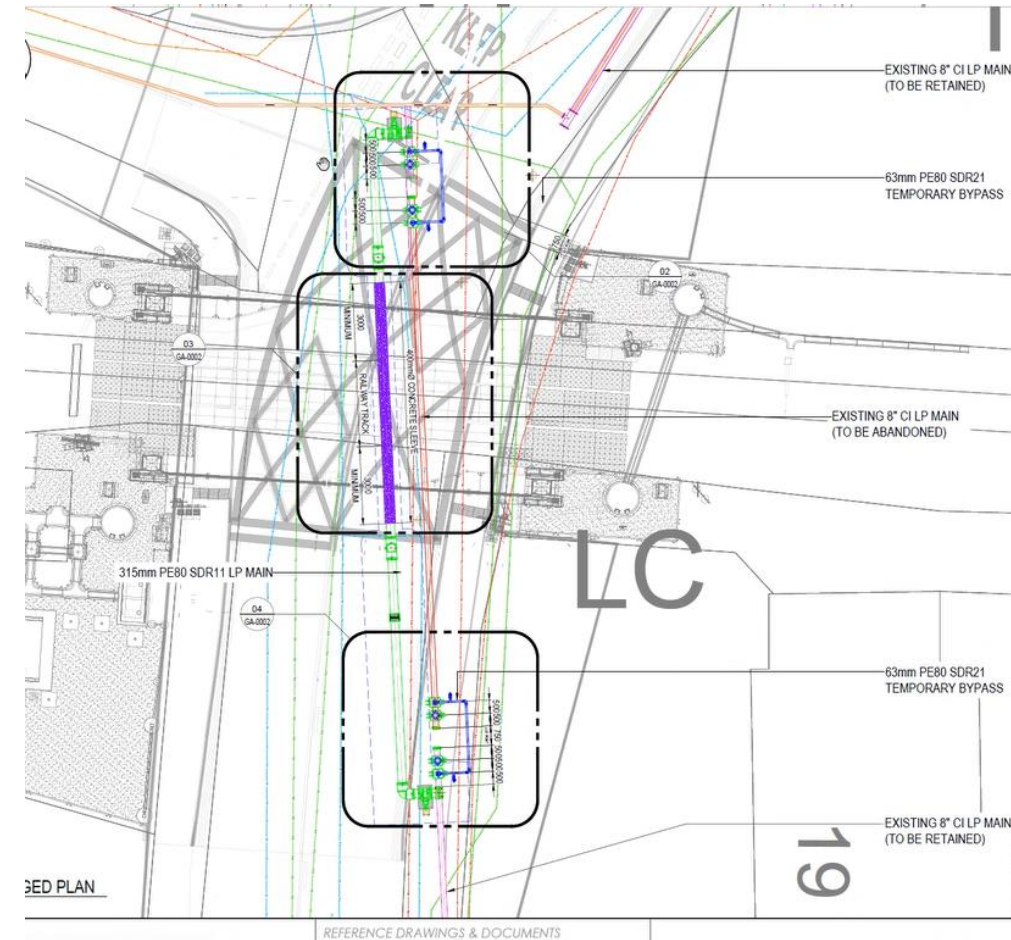
Rail Delivery – Branch line

- In May, railway closed for 9 days, allowing significant civils works to be undertaken at Saxmundham Junction. This included civil bases for power supply buildings, signalling equipment and electrification.
- Network Rail plan to undertake track works at Saxmundham Junction between 17 – 19 July
- Track tamping and welding works planned between West House LX and Saxmundham Junction in early July
- Civils construction underway across Branch line with troughing, signalling and electrification bases and routes being installed
- Network Rail commenced signalling & electrification works at Saxmundham Junction and starting on the Branch line in July.



Leiston Level Crossing

- Between 20 July – 10 August Leiston Level crossing will be closed to vehicles. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout
- Purpose of the work is to install a concrete sleeve to allow Cadent to install and commission a new gas pipe to ensure integrity of the gas network ahead of autumn and winter
- Works include excavating a deep excavation (more than 3.5m) in a narrow, service congested environment, to place a sleeve for the gas pipe, then handing over to Cadent to install and commission the gas pipe threaded through the sleeve
- In addition, trial trenches will be excavated to record the location of other services in the levels crossing, including the three water pipes known to exist, amongst others

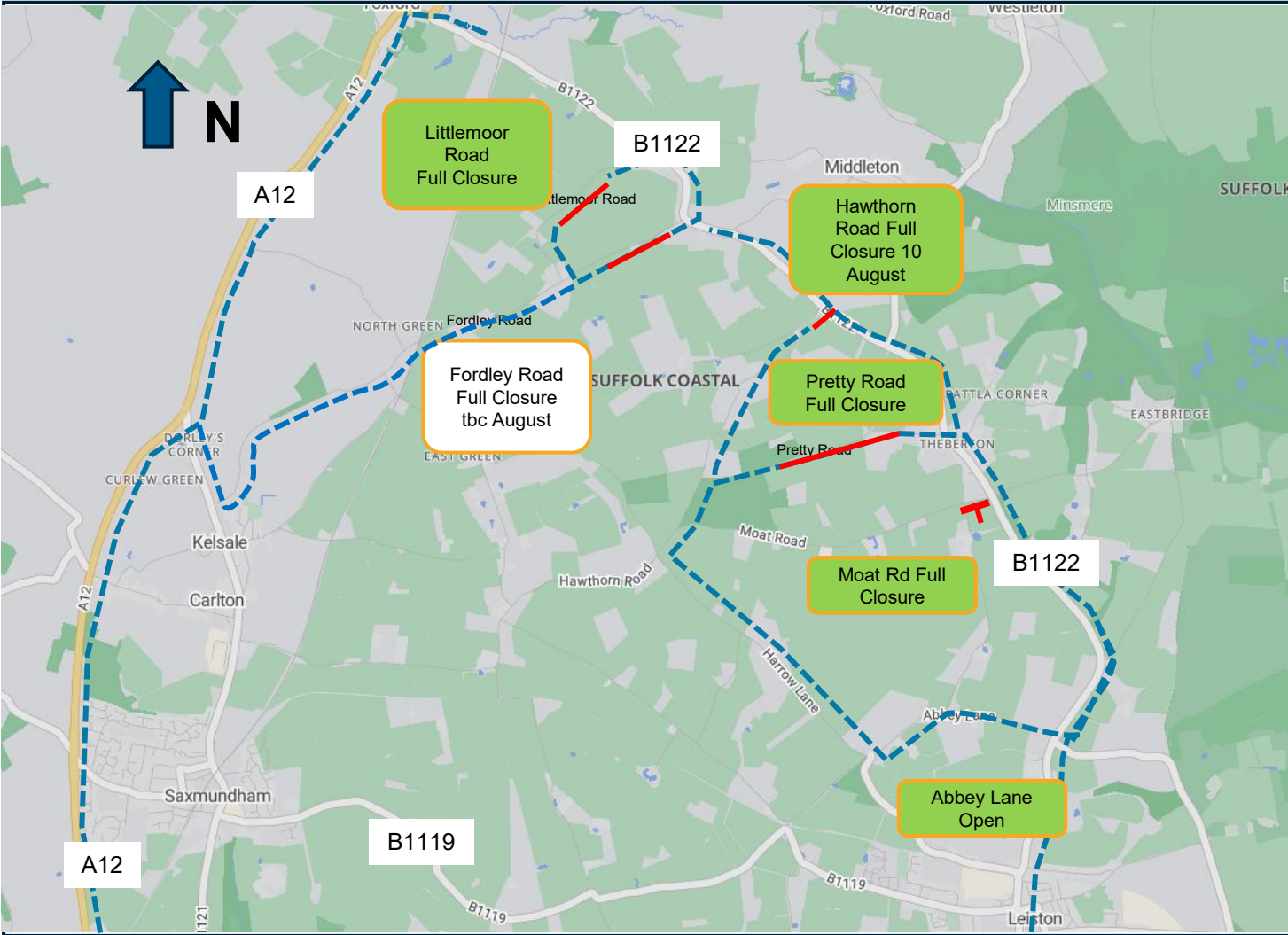

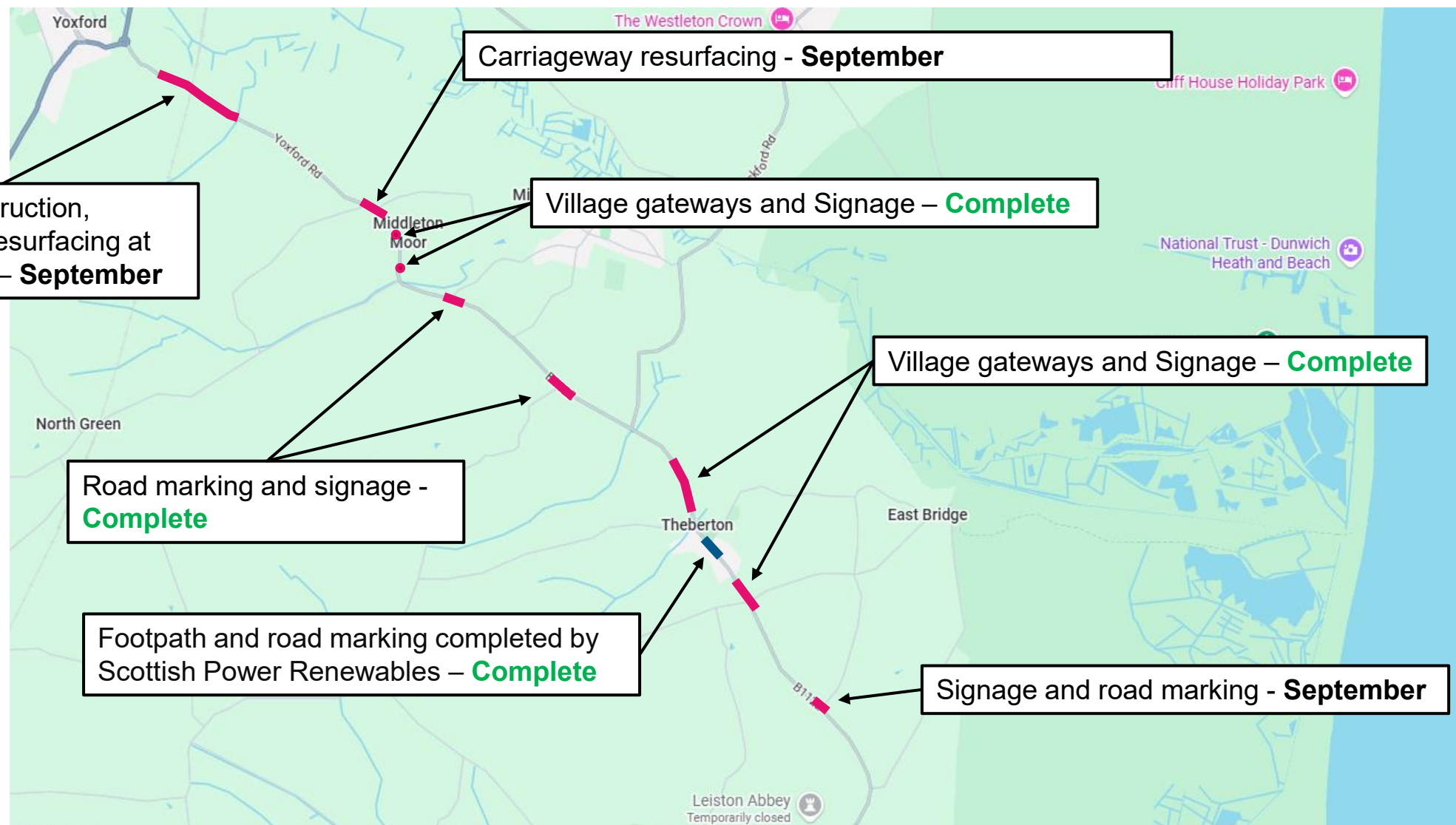

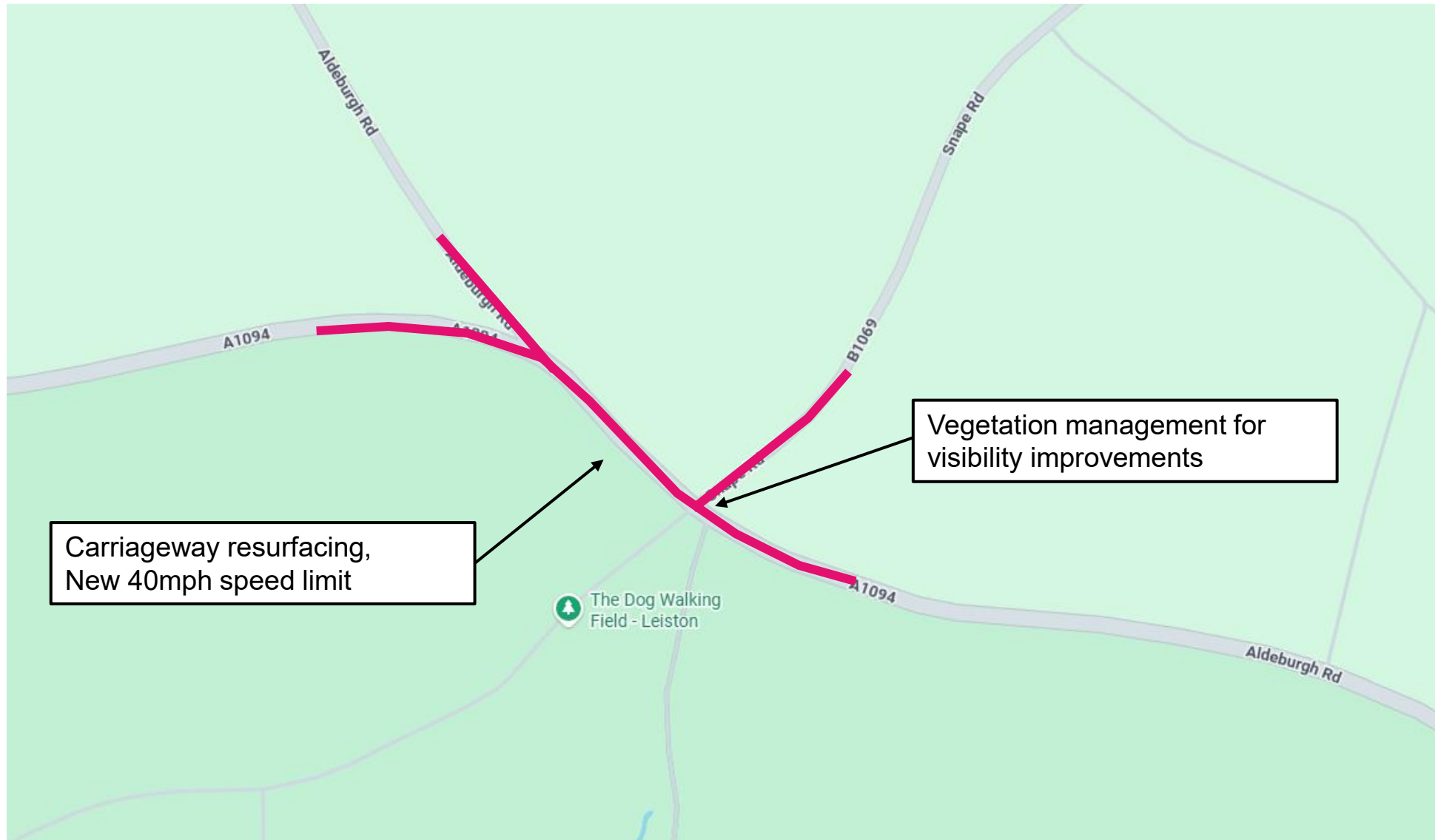

Where and when we're building Full Fibre Broadband

Our Full Fibre rollout across the UK

We're committed to building the best digital future for the UK, so were on an ambitious plan to deliver Full Fibre broadband to 25 million homes and businesses by 2026 and we're not stopping there.

We have so far connected over 22 millions homes and businesses onto our network.

We intend to keep building after that - to as many as 30 million premises by the end of the decade – assuming the conditions for investment are still supportive.

Our plans support the UK Government's ambition of making Gigabit capable broadband available to more than 99% of premises by 2032.

In doing this, we've committed to being as clear as we can to support the understanding of our progress.

This is a monumental change to the UK's communication infrastructure and it's a hugely complex engineering project with lots of moving parts and technical challenges.



FTTP Connectivity

How is the FTTP rollout progressing?

Our work in East Anglia has progressed well, with over 270k premises connected so far in Suffolk and over 310k in Norfolk.

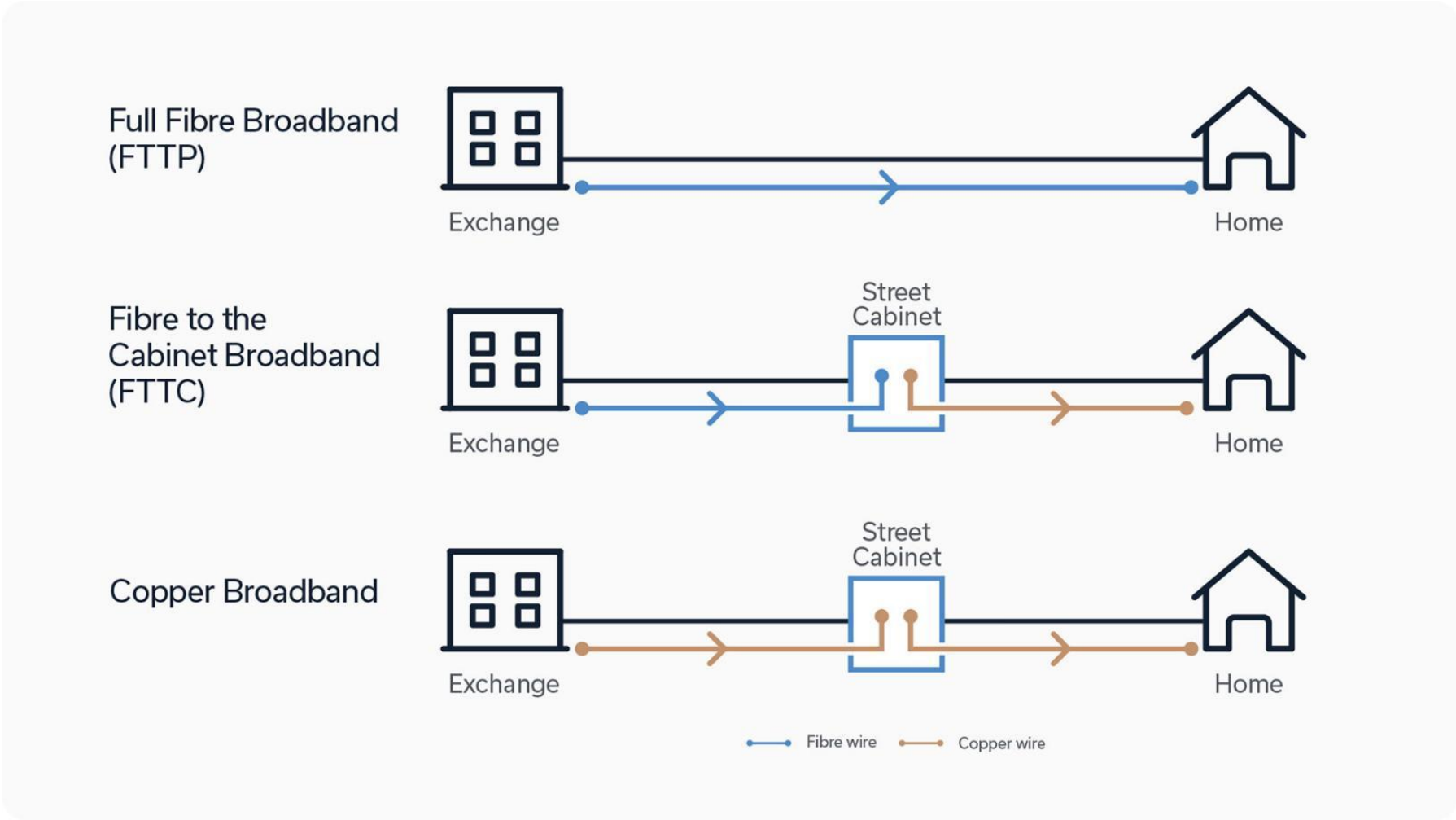
Close to 70% of all homes and businesses across the 2 counties can now order a service from their chosen provider, upgrades are not automatic so residents should check our website at www.openreach.co.uk for coverage and reach out to their chosen provider.

Demand for our services is strong, with close to 50% of properties now taking a service on our FTTP network.

There are close to 50k MDU (Multiple Dwelling Units) which are yet to be connected. MDU's require wayleave agreement by the freeholder,

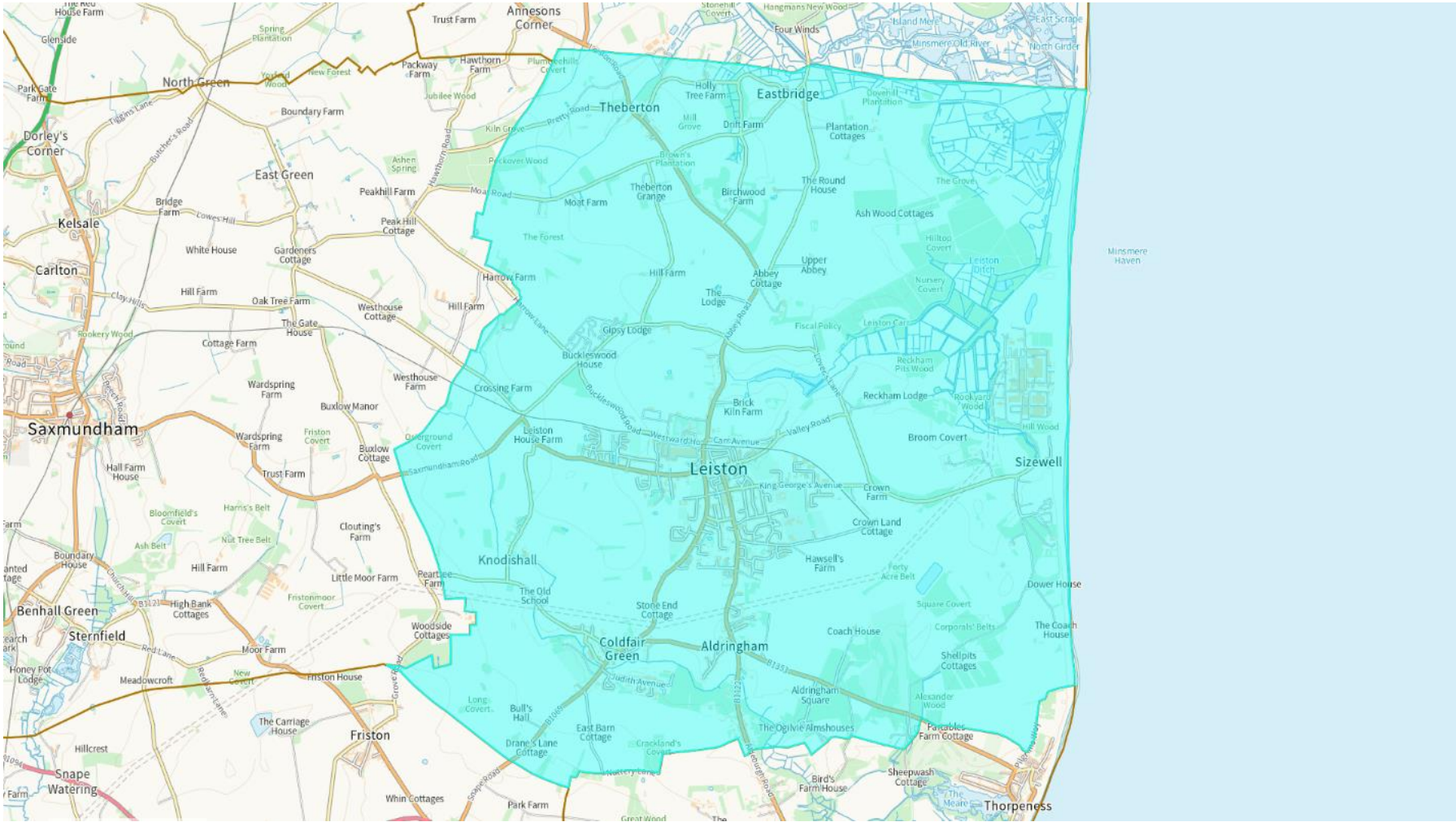


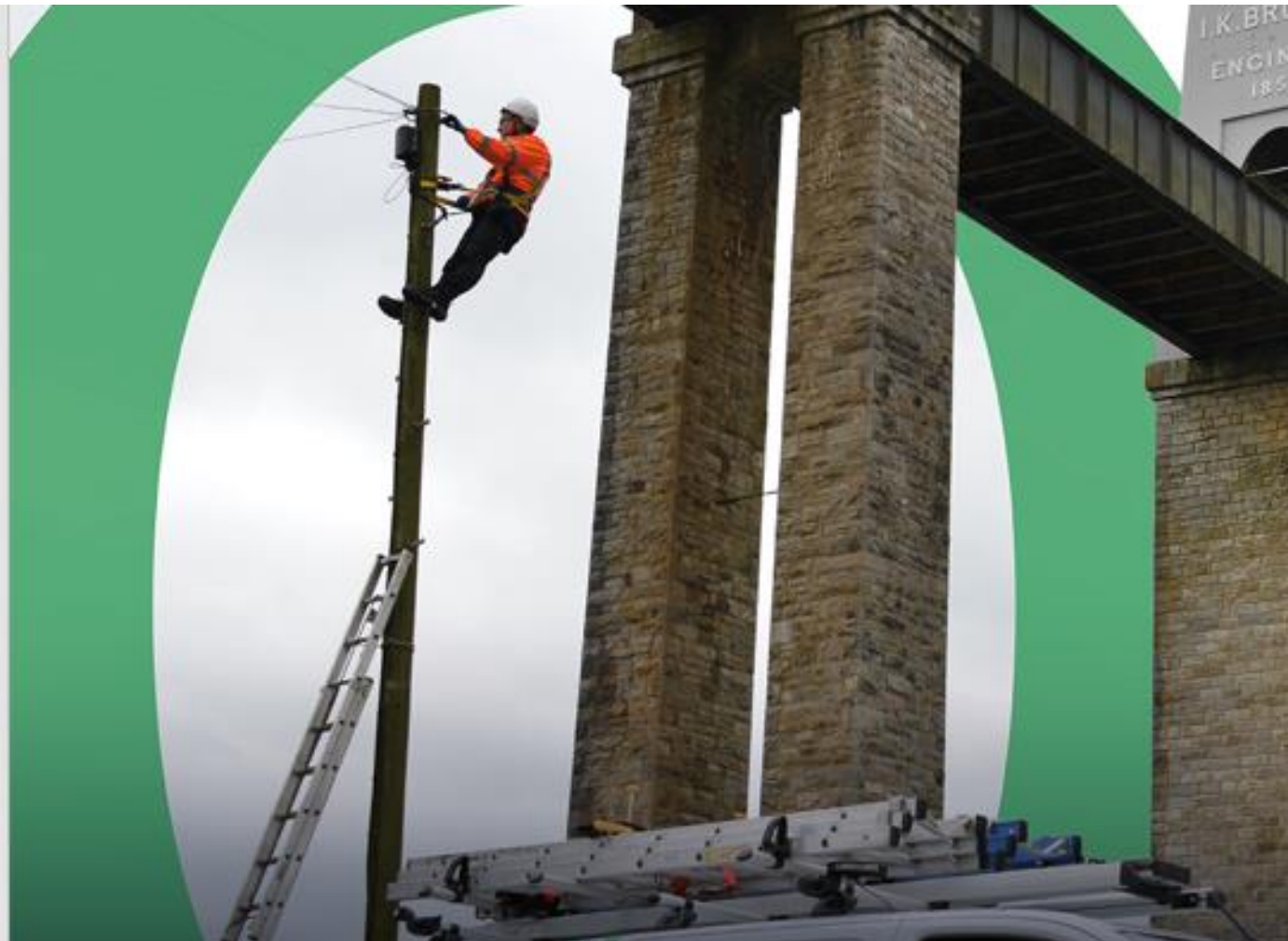

- Helped organised the traffic management and civils work required to reach areas such as Theberton and Eastbridge

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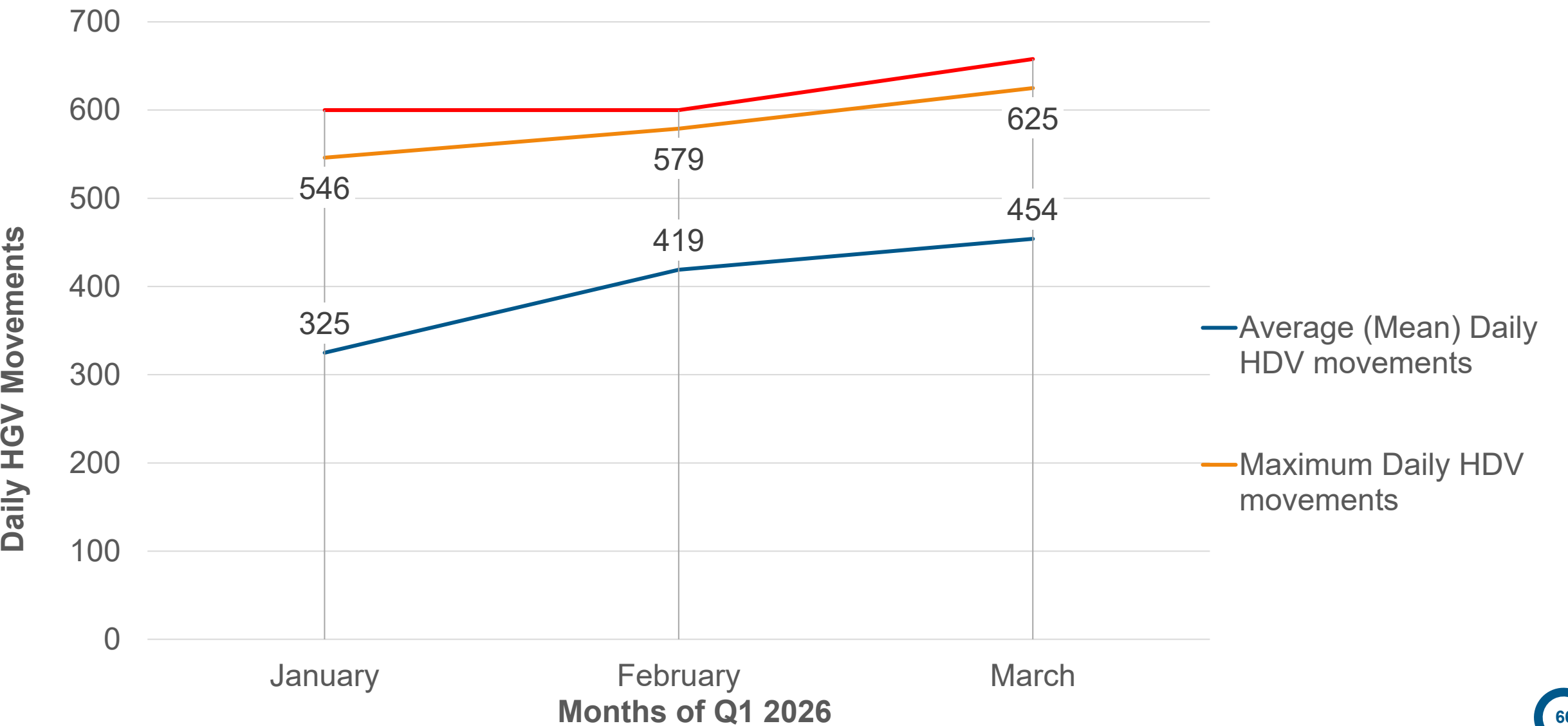

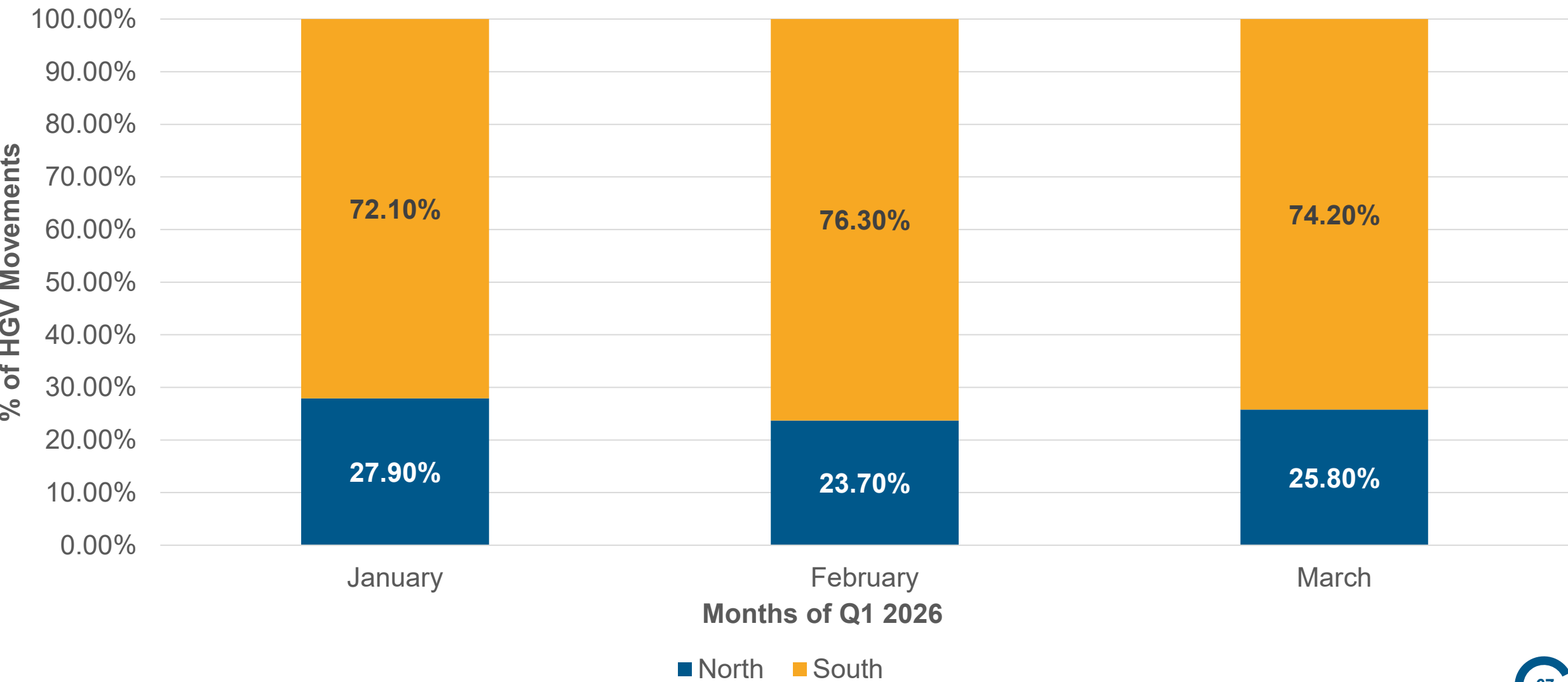
Transport Monitoring Report Q1 2026

Average (mean) and Maximum Daily HGV Movements

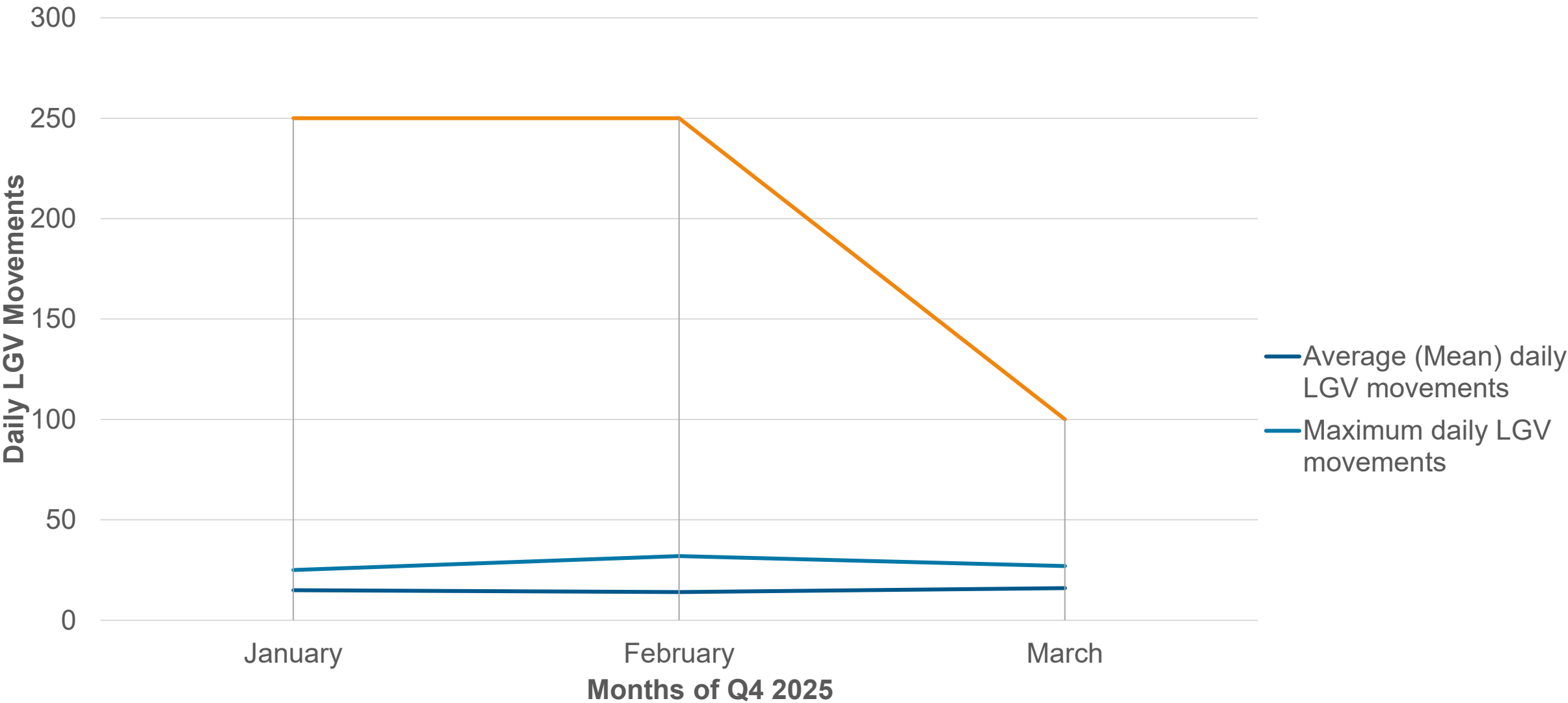


Transport Monitoring Report Q1 2026

Item 7: Q&A via Town and Parish Council Representatives

Aldeburgh Town Council (ATC)

Q1. ATC requests a thorough update of tangible actions and benefit felt by local businesses since February from the Sizewell Tourism governance committee.

Q2. ATC notes the following road diversions on the A12 on the Sizewell latest tracker email. These are peak times of travel for festival and holiday makers either arriving into or leaving Aldeburgh. Given it's our main economy, what PR signage and mitigation is Sizewell tourism committee proposing for the travelling public to persevere and to persuade them to return again to our area?

Friday Street

The A12 / A1094 will be closed from 8pm to 5am on the nights of 11 to 19 July for resurfacing works. The diversion routes will be:

A12 Diversion Route: A1152, B1069, A1094, B1069, B1122 and vice versa

A1094 Diversion Route (South): A1094, B1069, A1152, A12

A1094 Diversion Route (North): A1094, B1069, B1122, A12

Leiston-cum-Sizewell Town Council

The Council has major concerns about the change of use for the Associated Construction Site (ACA) on the land east of Eastlands Industrial Estate (LEEIE). The DCO outlined the plans for a touring caravan park for contractors and although we had concerns about vehicular movements and contractor numbers so close to the town, this would have been a relatively low impact site. However, there are now plans for a steel rebar factory close to properties on the east of the town and rail deliveries throughout the construction period, when initially the rail was only intended for use in the early years. This is in addition to the construction of the College in the neighbouring field, which although welcome, increases the radical change to the east of town, which will impact on residents and increase HGV traffic.

Please can SZC tell us

Q1. what is the HGV route to site for the fabricated steel?

Q2. how many years will the factory be in operation and what extra mitigation measures will be in place for residents close to the railway line and the factory itself, who currently have no mitigation offered despite regular night time movements?

Q1. We are fully aware that the possibility of having a pedestrian crossing is a lengthy process. However, during the last few weeks with the addition of the outage at SZB and weekend closures of the Yoxford roundabout, traffic through the village has increased substantially, with residents asking for updates on the feasibility study. Please could we have a timeline.

Q2. Work on the B1094/B1069 at Blackheath Corner appears to have been completed for now. The junction still floods and visibility has not improved. What additional work is planned to rectify this?

Pat Hogan – Sizewell C Residents

Q1. Can you please give an update on your intentions for the use of Sizewell Beach Car Park for your workers, and your understanding of any role of monitoring you may or may not have for daytime and overnight parking, given the presumably permanent notice now put up by East Suffolk Council

Q2. In the June Project update it mentions installing rock armour around the southern end of the temporary sea defence - work required to protect Sizewell B operations. Can you give some idea of the extent of this, and does this mean that you have found considerably more erosion of the coast than previously thought?

Middleton-cum-Forley Parish Council

Q1. Hawthorn Road Closure

As regards the suggested early closure (of Hawthorn road) idea, residents will appreciate this AS LONG AS access to properties from the B1122 remains open to them. Can this be done?

Has the feasibility of bin collections and oil deliveries, once the road is closed at the SLR, been looked into in terms of vehicle turning circles?

Notwithstanding the closure date, have you communicated with residents that their road will be closing?

Q2. SLR meetings

Middleton and Theberton have since the autumn been asking for meetings with SZC and SCC to cover the many fine details of the construction and operation of the SLR in their parishes without taking up precious time in the NTF or MSF. We have agreed that while a specific working group or scheduled programme of meetings, was not needed, individual meetings would allow Middleton and Theberton PCs - and perhaps Kelsale - to talk about issues such as Q1 above, A meeting with SCC took place in the Spring, but SZC were unable to attend.

Why has SZC now refused to join such a meeting, stating "We will continue to update the community as works progress via the regular forums"?
